NEW WEIR ON THE STRULE

Matt Peach reported on the new weir being constructed on the River Strule at Omagh. He feels that it is unsafe and has passed the plans on to BCU for a technical opinion. The secretary will write to the Rivers Agency and Omagh District Council expressing our grave concern as the Strule is under consideration as part of the Foyle Canoe Trail.

COACHING QUALIFICATION

A query has been received about employers being informed if a coach has his/her coaching award revoked. It was agreed that if child protection was involved then the PECS agency would inform employers not CANI.

LONG TERM PADDLER DEVELOPMENT

An invitation has been received from SCNI to attend a meeting in the House of Sport on 11th December concerning the development of a Player Pathway structure. Council did not feel that we were ready to commit ourselves at this time.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The AGM will be held in the House of Sport on Monday 28th February. Mike Harron will not be standing for re-election and will ask for nominations in the newsletter. CANI will also need a new representative on the BCU Board. Robin Ruddock has been nominated as CANI's representative on the Lower Bann Advisory Committee. Davy Maxwell will continue to be CANI's representative on the USRT. Rosemary Harron will not be available as a Child Protection Officer and therefore a new officer will need to be appointed.
