MAGHERAMORNE QUARRY

Clare Wright from Countryside Access and Activities Network made a presentation on the development of Magheramorne quarry near Larne. The quarry has 2 lakes which are open for development. Lafarge Cement wish to develop the site for sporting activities including mountain biking and diving. Discussion took place on possible uses for canoeing and possibly constructing a whitewater course. Clare wanted to know if she should include canoeing in the feasibility study and council felt it was worth discussing. A whitewater course so near the ferry port could prove economically viable.

DEVELOPMENT OFFICER REPORT

Matt Peach reported that Fermanagh District Council wish to know how best to include canoeing in their Tourism and Recreation Strategy. Council suggested an outdoor canoe polo site. A sprint/marathon course is also a possibility.

Ferguson McIlveen are carrying out a river study for Strabane Council. They want to know how best the waterways can be used for waterbased activities. The area under consideration is between the Fir Trees Hotel on the Strabane-Omagh road and the mouth of the old canal at Strabane.
